# SAS Plans to Reduce Transatlantic Fares By Up to 50 Pct. 


#### Abstract

OSLO-The Scandinavian Airines System (SAS) will introduce cuts of up to 50 per cent in its North Atlantic flight prices unless an international agreement on common prices is reached, said Thursday. SAS was to apply to the Scandinavian and U.S. governments later in the day to gain permission for the drastic price cuts. The proposed prices would go into effect Feb. 1 provided that the International Air Transport Association (IATA) members fail to reach agreement on a common price plan, the radio common price plan, the radio said. An ordinary round-trip ticket would cost 1,450 kroner (\$207) if the passenger stayed on the other side of the North Atlantic other side of the North two and three weeks. Group fares in the low season would be $\$ 190$, or $\$ 13$ less than Lufthansa, the West German Lutline, has offered. This is airline, has offered. This is The last chance to reach agreement between the airlines o avoid a price war will be a meeting Nov. 22 in Paris, the radio said. It predicted that would agree to the prices set by SAS. Another international airline, Alitalia, Wednesday reduced first-class, round-trip fares befrom New York and Rome economy fare from $\$ 604$ to $\$ 420$. During the peak season of June, July and August, the basic economy round-trip fare will be cut from $\$ 740$ to $\$ 540$. The new regular-season fares go in effect Feb. 1. Alitalia also said it will file with the U.S. Civil Aeronautics Board a proposal for 22- to $90-$ day round-trip excursions from New York to Rome of $\$ 270$ in the off-season and $\$ 355$ in the peak months. However, youth fares will be raised from the present $\$ 199$ to $\$ 210$ in the off season and to $\$ 230$ in the peak months.
