German terrorists explode bomb BONN, West Germany — Terrorists struck in West

Germany today for the first time since the prison deaths of three Baader-Meinhof guerrilla leaders nearly two weeks ago.

Police said a bomb exploded shortly after midnight at a

courthouse in Zweibruecken in the Saar near the French border. The blast badly damaged the building but no one was injured. The attackers escaped.

Radicals throughout Western Europe launched a wave of bombings against German property following the Oct. 18 deaths of terrorist leader Andreas Baader and two comrades in a Stuttgart prison, but until today Germany was spared.
