

Radical Lawyer Is Returned

STUTTGART, West Germany (AP) — Radical lawyer Klaus Croissant was returned from France to West Germany during the night to face charges of aiding the Baader-Meinhof gang of terrorists. The 46-year-old attorney, who defended **Andreas Baader** during the trial that ended with his imprisonment on murder charges, was turned over to the West German government after a French court rejected his request for political asylum. A spokesman for the state justice ministry would not say where Croissant was. But other sources indicated he probably would be taken to Stammheim prison, the maximum-security Stuttgart prison where most terrorists are held and where Baader and two others convicted with him died last month. The government said they killed themselves. Croissant fled from West Germany last July, claiming official harassment and intimidation was preventing him from defending his clients.
