

Bombs Hit Businesses

ROME (AP) — Police Tuesday reported two more attacks on West German commercial establishments in Italy and said one was followed by a threat of further violence unless the West German ambassador leaves the country.

Police in Florence said an arson fire damaged a suburban office of Hoechst Italia, the Italian subsidiary of a German pharmaceutical company. An unexploded powder-filled bag with a fuse also was found, police said.

They said an anonymous telephone caller later told the news agency Ansa that "units fighting for communism" had set the fire to revenge the deaths of **Andreas Baader** and two other convicted terrorists in a West German prison last month.

In Cagliari on the island of Sardinia, a blast shattered windows in a showroom displaying German automobiles, authorities said.
