## gets 20 years

A Dutch Court today sentenced West German urban guerrilla Knut Folkerts to 20 years'

imprisonment for the murder of a policeman, after rejecting arguments that he was a resistance

fighter against Imperialism.
Folkerts, a leading member of the Red Army Faction, once also known as the Bander-Meinhof

group, chose to stay out of the court-room as Judge Karel Bleger read the verdict of the three-man bench.

Police with steel helmets, carbines and builet - proof vests patrolled inside and outside the building. Nearby streets were sealed off and all journalists and

spectators were searched.

The Court found the

German guilty of the "cold - blooded and premeditated" murder of Detective Sergeant Arie Kranenburg, shot in the back during a gun-battle in September.

He was also found guilty of the attempted murder of a detective who was hit in the stomach by two bullets from Folkerts's revolver.

West Germany has requested Folkerts's extradition and regards him as a suspect in both the Schleyer case and the shooting last April of Chief Public Prosecutor Siegfried Buback.

No date has been set for the hearing, which will probably be in Maastricht. Folkerts is expected to appeal, his lawyers said.— Reuter.
