

RAID BY EXTREMISTS WOUNDS 3 IN BERLIN

BERLIN, May 14—Four political extremists, two of them women, shot their way into a West Berlin scientific institute today, wounding three persons, to free a 28-year-old prisoner. The four escaped with the prisoner.

The raid followed recent assaults and bomb attacks by anarchists in West Berlin.

In the raid today, Goerg Linke, a 62-year-old employe at the German Institute for Social Affairs, was critically injured by a bullet in the abdomen. Also wounded were two prison guards who had accompanied the prisoner, Andreas Baader, to the institute. Baader was sentenced in West Germany last year to 36 months in prison for setting fire to a Frankfurt department store.

This morning he was taken to the Social Affairs Institute in the suburb of Dahlem, where he said he wanted to check a register for research on a book he was writing. Shortly after his arrival, the four extremists burst into the building, spraying tear gas and firing from at least two pistols.
