A FOURTH ANARCHIST SEIZED BY GERMANS

BONN, June 7—The Hamburg police today announced the arrest of a leading member of a band of anarchists that has claimed responsibility for bomb blasts that killed four American servicemen and injured 30 persons last month. The arrest is the fourth in West Germany in a week.

The police seized Gudrun Ensslin, 31 years old, sought for two years since she participated in freeing Andreas Baader, 29, from a Berlin jail. Miss Ensslin is also wanted for bank robbery. She was arrested in a downtown shopping center.

Baader was captured last Thursday in Frankfort after an exchange of fire with policemen. Two other suspects, Holger Meins, 30, and Jan-Carl Raspe, 27, were also seized then.

The ideologist of the group, Ulrike Meinhof, 37, a former journalist, is still at large, as are 14 other associated with it. The group, self-styled the Red Army Faction and popularly known as the Baader-Meinhof gang, consists of leftist-anarchists and preaches terror against imperialism as a means of achieving revolution.

The members are suspected of a series of thefts of cars, weapons, explosives and documents, and of bank robberies and several clashes with the police in which at least three policemen have been killed.
