

Terrorists Captured

OFFENBACH, Germany (AP) — Two more members of the West German terrorist Baader-Meinhof gang were arrested Saturday as they stood at a kiosk in this city bordering Frankfurt.

Police identified the men as Klaus Juenschke, 24, and Irmgard Moeller, 25. A third unidentified person, who police said was a peripheral member of the gang, was captured and one person escaped. All three of those arrested were armed, police said.

The arrests were the latest in a string starting June 1 when Frankfurt police laid siege to

an apartment house in Frankfurt and flushed out gang leader Andreas Baader with two top gang lieutenants.

Further arrests throughout West Germany and West Berlin since then have put the bulk of the gang—including Baader's girl friend Gudrun Ensslin and band ideologist Ulrike Meinhof—behind bars.

The gang is suspected by police of bombings this year in West Germany that killed four American servicemen and wounded 36 other persons, shootouts with police, bank robberies and other crimes.
