

German tyconn's kidnapers set new demands deadline

BONN, West Germany (UPI) — The kidnapers of a prominent industrialist Monday set a new deadline of midnight for the government to release 11 jailed terrorists in exchange for the life of their hostage.

It was the third deadline set by the kidnapers of Hanns-Martin Schleyer. Two previous deadlines passed without the government meeting the demands. After each of those, the kidnapers sent fresh evidence that Schleyer was alive.

Chancellor Helmut Schmidt called a crisis group together after a man claiming to represent the kidnapers set the new deadline of midnight (7 p.m. EDT) in a telephone call to the Bonn office of a French news agency.

Five urban guerrillas kid-

naped Schleyer, chairman of the Employers' Association and a director of the firm that produces the Mercedes Benz automobile, in Cologne last Monday after killing his driver and three police bodyguards.

The guerrillas have demanded that the government free the 11 jailed terrorists, give them each \$44,000 and fly them out of the country.

The government said Sunday it would not be able to get a crew to fly the group out of the country unless they were given prior notice of the destination. It also asked for details of the plan the kidnapers would use to free Schleyer.

The jailed terrorists and kidnapers are members of the Baader-Meinhoff gang or the **Red Army faction**, a group

which has claimed responsibility for two previous violent attacks this year.

In April, two persons riding a motorcycle murdered Federal Prosecutor General Siegfried Buback and two men with him. Five weeks ago, two women and a man murdered Juergen Ponto, chairman of the republic's second largest bank.

The German public, for the most part, has not learned of the new deadline. The government has sought to deny the kidnapers use of the media to broadcast their threats and demands.

The call to the French news agency was referred to briefly on one radio station and in a brief report on the agency's own German-language service.
