Hamburg rail depot bombed

HAMBURG, Germany (UPI)

— A bomb exploded in Hamburg's main railroad station
Saturday injuring at least 11
persons and causing heavy
damage. The Red Army Faction urban guerrilla gang
claimed responsibility for the
blast and warned other bombs

were hidden in the terminal.

Hundreds of travelers and Saturday strollers fled the station in panic after the bomb went off in a baggage locker. Police cordoned off the area around the station and all train traffic in Hamburg's main railroad station one of Germany's busiest, came to a halt.

A police spokesman said the bomb went off at 4:30 p.m. He said that two minutes before the blast, an anonymous caller, identifying himself as a member of the "Commando Ralf

Reinders" of the Red Army Faction gang, told the city's fire department that a bomb would go off.

Reinders was arrested Tuesday in West Berlin in connection with the nation-wide hunt for the kidnapers of Peter Lorenz, leader of the opposition Christian Democrats in the divided city

Reinders is alleged to be a member of the "Movement of June," a branch of the Baader Meinhof guerrilla group which kidnaped Lorenz in February and only released him after authorities freed five other guerrillas from jail and flew them to South Yemen told

police that the self-styled Red Army Faction urban guerrilla gang claimed responsibility for the attack

The spokesman said the anonymous caller also told police that more bombs were hidden in the railroad station. Andreas Baader and Ulrike Meinhof, the gang's alleged leaders, are currently being tried in Stuttgart on murder, bombing and arson.
