

# Doubts on German suicides

BONN, Wednesday. — The bullets which killed terrorists Andreas Baader and Jan-Carl Raspe in their prison cells yesterday were fired from behind the head, lawyers who attended the autopsies said today.

Mr Otto Schilly, the lawyer who defended the third dead terrorist, Gudrun Ensslin, said the bullet which killed Baader went through the skull and

emerged through the face.

He said Ensslin was found hanging from a cable wrapped several times round her neck.

The authorities claim the three had committed suicide and had left notes to suggest they had been murdered.

But the officials were at a loss to explain how the prisoners had got the arms.

They have ordered an investigation into the three deaths

and have also asked three noted foreign pathologists to take part in the postmortems. Amnesty International has been invited to send an observer.

The decision has been taken apparently to forestall possible suspicions about the deaths.

Violent backlash has already erupted with bombs wrecking three showrooms of German

cars in the Italian cities of Turin and Leghorn. There have been protest marches in Rome, Milan, Genoa, Athens and London. (AAP-Reuter)
