

Newspaper gets picture of German kidnap victim

PARIS — (UPI) — The Paris leftist daily 'Liberation' published a photo yesterday of kidnapped West German industrialist Hans-Martin Schleyer and a statement from the **Red Army Faction** terrorist group demanding all searches for him be abandoned immediately.

The picture of Schleyer, kidnapped in Cologne Sept. 6, showed him sitting against a white wall marked with the star-emblem of the Red Army and holding a sign which read, "For 20 days a prisoner of the R.A.F."

The statement sent to Liberation and dated Sept. 26 said, "If the federal government is still attached to Schleyer's life, it

must immediately stop the searches undertaken in the Federal Republic as well as those undertaken in France, Holland and Switzerland.

"Our demand that all search operations cease is valid as in the past," the statement said. "We warn the federal government not to attempt to find, in any way, where the calls to Payot are coming from."

Denis Payot is a Swiss lawyer acting as a mediator between the Red Army terrorists and the West German government negotiating for Schleyer's release. The R.A.F. has, through Payot, demanded the liberation of 11 imprisoned members of their terrorist group
